<u>A Word from the Pastor – "Lifting Jesus Up"</u>

Happy New Year in our Lord as we move into the second month of the year and towards Lent! In this year of 2025, we are looking at the singular goal of "Lifting Jesus Up", how we do that individually and as a church community. I would like to start by saying the goal in Christianity is knowing Christ, abiding in Him, and as a result, becoming more Christlike. These are all things we are called to in scripture and as being a Christ-follower. And this leads to "knowing Christ and making Him known" as many Christian organizations declare and the scriptures bear out; the one naturally leads to the other, all part of the Christian journey. This mantra leads to its climax of being in the very presence of Christ as He is central and emanated to all of creation for all of eternity in the new heaven and new earth. Therefore, "Lifting Jesus Up" is tied into everything we are called to and what will be for all of eternity. As we hold this as a goal, knowing Jesus leads to lifting Him up.

So, let's look at some of the ideas involved with this. Jesus said in John 12:32 "when I be lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to me." Even though He was referring to His crucifixion (being lifted up from the earth), it only makes sense that when anything or anyone is lifted up, we think about this idea or person more and converse about it or Him with others. And as many times when Jesus spoke, there were multiple thoughts we could and do get from His words. But more than that, there is power in these words of Jesus, and we know there is power in Jesus and His name. So, what are we doing to lift Him and His name up, and likewise, drawing ourselves and others to His crucifixion and whole way of being?

John the Baptist, even though Jesus said of him no one born is greater (Matthew 11:11), said of Jesus, "He must increase, and I must decrease" (John 3:30). As many people and followers were drawn to John at the height of his ministry, he makes this statement. It behooves all of us to lift Jesus up as we minimize ourselves and maximize Him, just as Jesus said as recorded in Matthew 16:25 (parallels to John 12), "All who want to save their lives will lose them. But all who lose their lives **because of me** will find them." As we set our lives to the side and lift Jesus up, His purposes are revealed to and lived through us. May we be like John and decrease so that Jesus can increase. How do we do this?

Us decreasing and Jesus increasing can be as simple as how much do we think of Him? How much do we lift Him up in our internal thoughts? How much are we praying while we are going about our day-to-day tasks? Is He Lord? As we make conscious decisions to set aside ourselves and put Him first-place as often as it takes each day, then we start to gain a sense more and more of His Lordship in our lives. We want to do Bible study, desiring for Him to transform us. We want to read His Word. We want to pray and seek His face. We want to allow this internal dialogue of His Spirit talking to us and guiding us and our decisions. But we also realize and start to notice more vividly how our flesh and external circumstances are always at the door, ready to pull us away from Him directing our steps. Beyond this internal thought life and the battleground of the mind, as we choose Christ and live into His purposes, we also want to be with fellow believers who are trying to live out this life as well. We recognize we are on the same team, we can grow in trust of one another, community is God's design, transparency and authenticity are hallmarks of what we called into in Christian community, and being with one another not only helps us know Christ better but also helps to lift Him up and to find greater ways to do that together and with others we interact with.

A crescendo of small group discipleship of knowing Jesus and lifting Him up occurs in greater magnification of Jesus in our communal worship times. We want to lift Jesus up when we are together! Jesus living in greater amounts in us and us being better aligned with Him and within our groups brings greater impact as we join together, all people invited, centering wholeheartedly in lifting Jesus up during corporate worship. "May Jesus Christ be praised!" as the hymn "When Morning Gilds the Skies" helps us sing out.

And then the "Lifting Jesus Up" mantra does not stop there. May it spill out to the streets, in our work locations, all interactions with others, just as Jesus said, "I will draw everyone to me." Yes! We are called to be a witness, to witness boldly, and it takes place as we center on Jesus and lift Him up internally, personally, in small groups, in our whole church fellowship, and then through the Holy Spirit to anyone we encounter, as He leads us. Yes! Let us be "Lifting Jesus Up" in 2025 to ourselves and everyone!
